# 1. THE UNIVERSITY FOR FOREIGNERS PERUGIA

## 1.1 HISTORICAL NOTES ON THE UNIVERSITY

The University for Foreigners Perugia is the oldest and most prestigious Italian institution involved in teaching and research activities as well as in the diffusion of the Italian language and civilisation in all expressions. Its story began in 1921, when the lawyer from Perugia Astorre Lupattelli, who had been working on an ambitious project for a long time, set up the first superior culture courses in his city with the objective of transmitting his knowledge of the Umbria region throughout Italy and abroad and to illustrate its history, institutions, natural and artistic beauties. Up until 1926 the courses were held in the classrooms of the University of Perugia, one of the oldest and most famous Athenaeums of Italy, and in the Notary Halls of the historical Priori Building. Since 1927 the University has had its own premises within the prestigious Gallenga Building, located in the heart of the city. For several decades it operated as a Superior State Education Institute under a special order. With the law dated 17th February 1992, n° 204 it was ordered as a University which now includes: the Faculty of Italian Language and Culture, the Department of Comparative Cultures and the Department of Language Science.

The main location of Palazzo Gallenga is now connected to the four smaller buildings Lupattelli, Prosciutti and Valitutti which, located in the splendid countryside that surrounds the city and which is in walking distance of Palazzo Gallenga, are located at the centre of a complex which enriches the structures destined for teaching and research, beyond the prestigious Villa La Colombella, the historical patrician dwelling immersed in the green hills near Perugia, which completes the Institutes prestigious patrimony.

Apart from the courses in Italian Language and Culture there are also Degree Courses and Post-graduate Courses held by the University.

Many lessons are held in the Lupattelli, Valitutti and Prosciutti buildings, located in a park close to Via XIV Settembre, which can be reached from the railway station with a bus along the lines "A", "P" or "D" (the first stop of via XIV Settembre). They are just 10 minutes walking distance from Palazzo Gallenga through Porta Pesa.

## 1.2 THE ITALIAN UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

In 2002 the Italian university system underwent some important changes with a credit system being introduced (1 CFU Italian credit equates to 1 ECTS credit) and degree courses were subdivided into a first and second level, as in the following table:

## 1.3 ECTS (EUROPEAN CREDIT TRANSFER SYSTEM)

The ECTS programme (European Credit Transfer System) developed by the European Commission aims to create a common procedure not only in attributing academic credits but also in the system of evaluation to overcome the complexity of the different grade systems adopted by the various countries.

The ECTS grades offer complementary information with respect to the grades attributed to the student by the original institution, i.e. they are translated into the local system. In Italy the correspondence between ECTS grades and Italian University grades (out of 30) is as follows:

At the end of the study period in our University we will issue, upon request, a certificate that will certify the period of study and the exams carried out. The exam grade will be expressed out of 30 and in ECTS marks showing the relative number of credits achieved. The ECTS credit system is valid for Italian language and culture courses as well as for degree courses.

## ITALIAN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE COURSES

The Italian Language and culture courses, open to foreign citizens and Italians living abroad, as in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), are divided into 3 stages: Beginners, Intermediate and Advanced course, each of which has two levels.

Erasmus students may enrol in one of these courses according to their knowledge of the language which will be established by an entrance test.

## **2.2 HOW TO SIGN UP AS ERASMUS STUDENT AT THE UNIVERSITY FOR FOREIGNERS PERUGIA**

Once all formalities have been completed with the original university, the following documents must be sent to the Erasmus office:

- 1 - the Application Form
- 2 - the Learning Agreement
- 3 - the Application Form for courses in Italian Language and Culture
- 4 - a copy of the identity document

These documents must be filled in and sent to the Erasmus office by one of the following expiry dates:

Stay for the first six month period or the entire academic year:

**31<sup>st</sup> July**

Stay for the second six month period:

**31<sup>st</sup> December**

The Erasmus office must receive the documents at least 45 days before your arrival in Perugia, in order to organize everything and plan your stay.

**Before coming to Italy, please make sure that you have the following documents:**

CITIZENS FROM EU MEMBER COUNTRIES

- Identity card or passport (valid for the entire period of stay abroad).
- Assignment declaration for the LLP/Erasmus mobility grant before coming to Italy, please make sure that you have the following documents: documents certifying registration with the University, status of LLP/Erasmus student and the amount of the student mobility grant by the University you come from.
- European Health Card TEAM (see National Health Service) for assistance
- Documented address (if already available)
- N° 4 passport sized photographs.

CITIZENS OF NON-EU MEMBER COUNTRIES (TURKS)

**for a stay lasting more than three months**

- Passport + study visa issued from the Italian Diplomatic Authorities (Embassies and Consulates) in their country of origin, before arriving in Italy. The visa is issued only in the presence of an official declaration, issued by the University for Foreigners Perugia, certifying acceptance of the student in the Erasmus Programme. Therefore it is necessary to act well before the expected departure date as it takes several weeks to sort out all paper work.
- Assignment declaration for the Erasmus mobility grant. Before coming to Perugia, the student must request an official document certifying registration with the University and the status of the Erasmus student.
- Private health insurance to ensure medical assistance in Italy approved by the Italian Embassy abroad.

### **2.3 THE ERASMUS STUDIES LEAFLET**

Upon registration in the Erasmus office, each student will be given a booklet for registration of activities and exams carried out in this Athenaeum; it must be handed back at the moment of leaving the University in order to receive the final certificate.

It will be the student's responsibility, when taking exams, to show the booklet to the teacher to be signed and the marks registered.

The booklet must be kept in a safe place for the entire duration of the stay, as the exams taken and credits achieved will be needed to complete the final Transcript of Records.

### 3. EILC STUDENTS

#### 3.1 ERASMUS INTENSIVE LANGUAGE COURSES (EILCs)

The Erasmus intensive language courses (EILC) are courses aimed at teaching of uncommon languages and less studied languages in the European Union. For Erasmus students the initiative, financed by the European Commission, represents the opportunity to study for one month in the country itself, the language of the community before starting the true Erasmus period.

The University for Foreigners Perugia organises these courses in collaboration with the Italian LLP/Erasmus Agency in two periods: *summer* (during the months of July, August and September) specially designed for the students with scholarships for the first six months, and *winter* (during the months of January and February) specially designed for the students with scholarships for the second six months. Approx 400 places available.

#### HOW TO SIGN UP

Applications must be presented to the students' university institution, which will transmit them to the University for Foreigners Perugia within the times defined for each academic year:

- by the **1<sup>st</sup> June** for the summer period;
- by the **30<sup>th</sup> October** for the winter period.

#### ENTRANCE TEST

The Entrance Test takes place in the first days of the course and must be taken by all students as they need to be assigned to different classes. The same test is to be taken by both levels, Beginners and Intermediate and consists of a written and an oral test.

- The test must be taken even by complete beginners.
- The course level will be established exclusively by the results of the test.
- Any requests for changing from one course to another will be allowed, with the teachers consent, only during the first week of the course.

#### ATTENDANCE

Attendance is compulsory for the whole duration of the course.

The course ends with a final test which only the students who have attended may take. All participants will be issued with certification of attendance. Those who pass the final test will have 6 ECTS credits and a final mark.

The students selected will not have to pay any fees as the courses are financed by the European Commission. National Agencies or Universities of origin may grant supplementary scholarships for participating in these courses.

## COURSES DESCRIPTION

### Beginner Course:

Courses consist in 23 hours per week of lessons including the following subjects:

- Italian language (9 hours per week)
- Drill exercises, speaking practice, language laboratory, aspects of Italian culture (10 hours per week)
- Guided cultural visits (4 hours per week)

### Intermediate Course:

Courses consist in 23 hours per week of lessons including the following subjects:

- Italian language (9 hours per week)
- Drill exercises, speaking practice, language laboratory, aspects of Italian culture (7 hours per week)
- Specific language elements (3 hours per week)
- Guided cultural visits (4 hours per week)

## 4. SERVICES FOR STUDENTS

### 4.1 LIBRARY SERVICES

The Library of the University for Foreigners Perugia is specialised in Italian Literature, History and History of Art, in Etruscology, in Linguistics and in relative disciplines. It has approximately 80,000 volumes and more than 100 subscriptions to Italian and foreign magazines. It has subscriptions with 5 daily newspapers and 2 weekly magazines, which are available for all users to read. It adheres to the National Library Service, which among other opportunities also allows for consultation of the bibliographical data of all Italian libraries that have adhered to the service. It offers all students the following services: internal and external loans, consultation of the data banks on CD-ROM and floppy disks, consultation via internet, a photocopy service and delivery of documents and an e-mail service for academic reasons or for research. The Library is open from Monday to Friday, open non stop from 09:00 to 17:45.

The Centre for bibliographical orientation and documentation provides students and teachers at the University for Foreigners Perugia with important bibliographical data banks on-line and on CD-ROM. It offers assistance for bibliographical research and for the elaboration of bibliographies. It runs a functional supply service of documents and inter-librarian loans.

## 5. USEFUL INFORMATION

### 5.1 CITY OF PERUGIA

In the centre of Italy, in the midst of culture and art, Perugia is one of the most beautiful and interesting Italian cities in terms of artistic, cultural and historical tradition.

The city is located in a pleasant position on a hill approximately 500 metres above sea level. It was a very important Etruscan city, as illustrated by monuments such as the Etruscan Arch, Porta Marzia and the Etruscan Well. During the II century A.C. the Emperor Octavian encircled it and successfully besieged it calling it "Augusta Perusia". After the fall of the Roman Empire the city underwent numerous invasions until it became a free Municipality of the XI Century and during that period the city started to take on the urban aspect that now distinguishes it from others, enhancing it with splendid buildings, sculptures and paintings of a high value. During this period the city was often divided between civil battles carried out by various families such as Michelotti, Piccinino, Fortebraccio and Baglioni. The latter prevailed and dominated up until 1531, when the bloody "Salt War" broke out, which divided the population of Perugia and the Papal State, which imposed a new tax. The latter, having won the war, occupied the city and Pope Paul III Farnese, as a symbol of domination of the Church, had an imposing fortress called Rocca Paolina built by Antonio da Sangallo "the Younger". Papal power lasted until 1860, when Perugia became part of the Kingdom of Italy. The city has many important museums at an international level: the Archaeological Museum, with sections dedicated to the prehistoric period, the Roman and Etruscan eras, the Capitolare Museum and the National Gallery of Umbria, full of treasures in terms of paintings and sculptures from Umbria and Tuscany, dating from the Medieval period right through to the Renaissance.

The Academy of Fine Arts "Pietro Vannucci", founded during the XVI century, is located in Perugia where international painting and sculpture courses are held. Other well-known institutions are the Musical Conservatory "Francesco Morlacchi" and the "Augusta" Library which holds manuscripts and ancient volumes. Other numerous libraries offer precious study material from the most varied sectors.

Perugia is the capital of the Umbria region which includes other very important historical centres (Assisi, Gubbio, Foligno, Orvieto, Spoleto, Todi, etc.) - vital points for a tourist and cultural trip of rare beauty, which document the historical, artistic and cultural monuments and works of art of the whole territory.

Considering its geographical position within the centre of Italy, Perugia can be easily reached from many main cities: Florence and Rome are just a few hours away by train.

### 5.2 CLIMATE

The climatic characteristics of the Umbria region are typical of the internal peninsula region: the aspects of Mediterranean climate are moderate, because the region is not surrounded by the sea; therefore it is almost continental, especially in the mountain areas and basins. In the majority of the region, however, the temperature rarely reaches very low values during winter months.

### 5.3 ACCOMMODATION

The University for Foreigners of Perugia gives the students the possibility to choose amongst a wide range of accommodations by the means of the new on-line service named "Cercalloggio Umbria".



With Cercalloggio Umbria students can get information and reserve accommodations for their stay in Perugia even before they arrive. The website offers apartments, single and double rooms, residences, studio apartments and houses to let. The quality standards of the accommodations are under the strict control of the Regional Body for the Right to University Education (ADiSU), and the reservation service is free of charge.

## 5.6 NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE

Any citizen of an EU country has the right to medical treatment, both urgent and necessary in exactly the same way as all Italian citizens. Citizens from member countries of the European Union on a temporary stay abroad in Italy (for reasons of study, tourism or work) must have one of the forms for medical assistance in Italy issued by the country of origin: the European health card (TEAM\*) or its temporary substitute certificate ("CTRF").

### **Students from member countries of the European Union**

In order to make use of the services offered by the National Health Service they must register with the facility (hospital, first aid, general practitioner) by showing the TEAM card or the temporary substitute certificate.

**Students from countries that do not belong to the European Union** must remember that no official treaties exist as regards coverage of medical costs\*\*. They must take out an international insurance policy which covers all medical costs in the case of medical treatment or hospital stays which must be validated by the consulate.

An alternative procedure may be to take out a policy in Italy, which includes coverage for urgent hospital stays. In this case the forms must be collected from the Erasmus office. Health insurance is a fundamental requirement in order to obtain a stay permit.

\* The **TEAM card** (or the temporary substitute certificate) will allow any citizen in a temporary stay abroad in an EU Country to receive any "necessary medical care" (and not only urgent care previously guaranteed by the E111 form). The new regulation issued by the European Commission (CE 631/2004, modifying regulations 1408/71 and 574/72 on sanitary services abroad) has been approved and provides for the correspondence of rights and defines the principle of direct access to medical care. Therefore, it will not only be possible to receive initial care from "first aid" as used to occur in the past, but also a right to all kinds of treatment: for example, hospital care, treatment by on-duty medical units, general practitioners and medical emergency services.

\*\* Citizens from countries that do not belong to the European Union but have a social security convention with Italy, in temporary stay in Italy who possess certification issued in their country of residence, will receive any medical care guaranteed by that convention. The countries that do not belong to the European Union and have a social security convention are:

Argentina, Australia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Cape Verde, Croatia, Kosovo, the Principality of Monaco, the Republic of Macedonia, the Republic of San Marino, Serbia and Montenegro, Tunisia and Vojvodina.

In order to obtain the form giving right to medical care guaranteed by the bilateral conventions, the citizens from countries that do not

belong to the European Union must go to the Local Health Authority of Perugia (ASL n. 2) with the certificate of the country of origin and their identity papers.

## **APPENDIX: FUNDAMENTAL STEPS IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE EU**

Years and years have passed since we first started talking about Europe. Before it became a real political project, the idea of Europe was the patrimony of a very few, that is to say, a limited circle of intellectuals, philosophers and idealists.

With the idea born from resistant movements against totalitarianism, the concept of an organization of the continent capable of overcoming national antagonisms became more and more feasible. In September 1946 Winston Churchill launched an appeal in favour of a kind of "United States of Europe" in a speech at the University of Zurich.

But **the first real mile stone** dates back to 9th May 1950, when, in a speech inspired by Jean Monnet, Robert Schuman, French Foreign Affairs Minister, proposed that France and Germany and any other European state that wanted to, put together their coal and steel production resources (Schuman Declaration).

In an attempt to carry out a **simple excursus through the history of Europe**, we can proceed in the following stages.

**1951:** on 18th April the institutional **Treaty of Paris** of the European Coal and Steel Community (ECSC) was signed by six countries (Belgium, Germany, Luxembourg, France, Italy and the Netherlands).

**1957:** The **Treaty of Rome** was signed, with the creation of the European Atomic Energy Community (EURATOM) and the European Economic Community (EEC). They both became effective on 1st January 1958.

**1967:** merging of the institutions of the three European Communities. 1973: entrance of Denmark, Ireland and the United Kingdom. The Community increased from six to nine members.

**1981:** entrance of Greece to the European Community.

**1985:** the ten members reached an agreement for the revision of the Treaty of Rome and the new launch of European integration, through the preparation of a Single European Act.

**The Single European Act** was signed in February 1986 and valid from 1st July 1987.

**1986:** entrance of Spain and Portugal.

**1990:** on 19th June the **Schengen Convention** was signed (Luxembourg), the Convention for the application of the Schengen Acquis dated 14th June 1985, signed by France, Germany, Belgium, Luxembourg and the Netherlands and related to the gradual elimination of controls at the frontiers. 15 countries currently belong to the Schengen Convention: Italy, Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Iceland, Luxembourg, Norway, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain and Sweden.

**1992: The Treaty of Maastricht** (Holland) introduced new forms of cooperation between the governments of the member States, for example in terms of defense and the field of "justice and foreign affairs". By adding this form of inter-governmental cooperation to the existing "community" system, the Treaty of Maastricht created the European Union (EU). This Treaty, which was valid from 1st November 1993, defined a very ambitious program for the member States: the creation of a monetary union, the preparation of new common politics, the institution of European citizenship, the creation of foreign policies and mutual security, the organization of internal security.

**1992:** the EU decided to create the **Economic and Monetary Union (EMU)**, which included the introduction of a European single currency handled by the European central bank: the Euro became a reality on 1st January 2002 and replaced the national currencies in 15 countries belonging to the EU (Belgium, Germany, Greece, Spain, France, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Austria, Portugal and Finland).

**1995:** the entrance of Austria, Finland and Sweden in the EU.

**1997:** a revision clause established by the Treaty of Maastricht led the member States to negotiating a new Treaty, subsequently signed in Amsterdam on 2nd October 1997 and effective from 1st May 1999. From a juridical point of view, **the Treaty of Amsterdam** modified some regulations of the Treaty on the European Union, as well as the Treaties set up by the European Community and some related acts; this is additional to, but does not replace, other Treaties; it renews and strengthens the politics and instruments of the Union, in terms of judicial cooperation, the free circulation of people, foreign policies and public health.

**December 2000: the Treaty of Nice**, adopted during the European Council held in Nice and signed on 26th February 2001, it opened the road for the institutional reforms necessary for the subsequent extension of the European Union to candidates of Western and Southern European countries. It was confirmed by all member States in compliance with the respective constitutional regulations and was effective from 1st February 2003.

**December 2000: Extension of the European Union.** The European Union welcomed another ten countries from Western and Southern Europe (Cyprus, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Slovenia and Hungary).

Bulgaria and Romania hope to enter the EU in 2007 and Turkey is also a candidate for membership.

The political and economic conditions to be satisfied in order to enter the Union, defined by the **Criteria of Copenhagen** are the following:

- the presence of stable institutions that guarantee democracy, rights, human rights, respect of minority groups;
- the existence of a vital market economy;
- the acceptance of community acquis: the capability of respecting all of the rules that make up the community and to carry out objectives of the political, economic and monetary Union

**October 2004: Signing of the New European Constitution.** The text of the European constitutional Treaty, approved during the Brussels summit held on 18th June 2004 by 25 Members of the State and Government of the EU, combines in one single organic document all previous treaties, from the oldest one of Rome that dates back to 1957 up to the most recent ones of Maastricht and Nice. For it to become effective, the Constitution must be approved by all member countries of the Union: some States will do so through their Parliaments, others through a popular referendum.

**January 2007:** Entrance of Bulgaria and Romania in the EU.
