













Writing on the Margins. Graffiti in Italy and beyond (7th – 16th c.)

First international conference of the ERC-2020-AdG Graff-IT project

Royal Netherlands Institute in Rome (KNIR) Rome, 10-12 April 2024

The first international conference of the ERC-2020-AdG Graff-IT Project aims at bringing together scholars from all over Europe who are concerned with the study of medieval and Renaissance graffiti as a historical source. "Graffiti" and "margins" are the two key, interrelated concepts which this conference wants to further explore from a European and multidisciplinary perspective, with papers embracing a broad chronological timeline that begins in the early Middle Ages and extends to include the early modern period (7th-16th c.).

Taken together, these two key-concepts explain the importance of graffiti as a historical source capable of providing first-hand evidence of a wide variety of aspects of past societies, and therefore, worthy of being studied in its own right, alongside the conventional ones. The conference, thus, seeks to provide an interdisciplinary forum for scholars who are willing to discuss several topics related to graffiti from continental and insular Europe, thereby contributing to an in-depth and better assessment of the material evidence uncovered from surveys within the Italian peninsula.
