

### Summer Courses in Italian Language and Culture for Erasmus Students

#### About the University

Founded in the early 1920's with the aim of teaching Italian civilization and artistic heritage to foreigners, this University has distinguished itself from the beginning as a symbol of open-mindedness and tolerance and as a meeting point for people of different cultures, is now a real laboratory of intercultural education.

It is renowned for its specialization of teaching Italian as a second language and everything that goes with it, such as art, literature and business.

Our institutional responsibility is to promote Italian language and culture throughout the world and to favour a greater appreciation for the diversities among us. The University is located in Perugia, one of the most interesting cities in Italy in terms of its artistic, historical and monumental patrimony. In central Italy, between Rome and Florence, Perugia is a lively and modern cultural centre characterized by a rich annual agenda of events and exhibitions, making it interesting all year round.

#### About the Program

Since 1999, The University for Foreigners of Perugia was commissioned by the National LLP Erasmus to organize language preparation courses for students in Erasmus mobility (EILCs) .

This University has hosted about 5,700 students and run 300 courses, getting a percentage of appreciation from the participants of more than 96%.

Starting in the academic year 2014/15, following the introduction of the Erasmus+ Program (2014 /20), these courses have been replaced by linguistic preparation courses conducted entirely online. In order to meet the needs of those students who are willing to expand their language training through courses that integrate traditional socio-cultural aspects and activities in the territory, the University intends to activate linguistic preparation courses " in presence ".

Strengths:

### Objectives of the courses

- To provide students with the abilities and skills necessary to stay in Italy at Institutions/Universities/Italian Companies;
- To maintain and develop the richness of Europe's cultural diversity.

### Level of the courses

Beginner and Intermediate (A1-A2-B1-B2) of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

N.B. the level of the courses activated will be established on the basis of the results of the compulsory entrance test that students will have to sit upon their arrival.

### Teacher and administrative staff

The teaching staff will be chosen exclusively among those teachers who have gained a relevant experience in the EILCs. Teachers, students and administrative staff are supported by tutors, students of the University for Foreigners preferably enrolled in the Degree courses in teaching of the Italian language. The number of tutors varies depending on the number of active courses (minimum 1 Tutor per class).

### Objectives of the courses

The beginner course is designed accordingly to the **Level A (A1-A2)** of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). At the end of the course students will understand frequently used sentences and expressions related to the university environment and communicate in routine tasks on matters referred to the social and university life. This should enable them to take part in different contexts in Italian society, focusing particularly on the various facets of the academic environment.

Language lessons will enable the student to acquire appropriate grammatical structures and vocabulary for expressing the most common linguistic functions. Primary skills will be developed to an equivalent level, with increasing attention being given to comprehension, the most vital skill required for student's participation in university activities. These objectives will be achieved on the basis of a syllabus drawn up for the purpose which will take account of the varying linguistic needs of the individual student. Furthermore, the methodology used will promote direct participation of students in all proposed activities. The course consists of language classes, practical exercises, and presentation of the main characteristics of the Italian culture.

The main objective of the intermediate courses, designed accordingly to the **Level B (B1 . B2)** of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) is to provide students with the necessary communication skills to allow them to take part in a correct and appropriate way in a variety of social and academic situations.

At the end of the course students can understand the main idea of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics, including those related to their field of study, and interact with good spontaneity with native speakers on familiar topics. They can also produce clear texts on a good range of subjects including their specific field of study in order to facilitate student's moving on to the next stage within the various university faculties. These objectives will be attained by exposing

students to a wide range of oral and written material and by adopting an approach which encourages their direct participation in class activities.

Starting from their basic knowledge of Italian, students will extend and improve their knowledge of those linguistic structures already mastered, by the means of a syllabus specifically drawn up for the purpose, and strategies adopted on the basis of their differing needs; this will allow them to formulate more linguistically competent answers and develop a wider vocabulary including that needed in specific areas.

### Methodology

The methodology used in the course is based on a socio-cultural communicative approach aiming at promoting direct participation of the students in all proposed activities. Students are encouraged to work in group to develop social and intercultural skills. The course syllabus is developed in two integrated stages by two different teachers.

Pedagogical and didactical approach, teaching methods to be used

Conversation classes focus mainly on the development of communicative skills through interactive and authentic activities and tasks, both inside and outside the classroom, in the social and academic environment. Language classes stress particularly on the development of linguistic and meta-linguistic skills and on the development of oral and written comprehension and production. Students are also helped by the tutors to work autonomously into the laboratory to widen and deepen their skills. Specific cultural and civilization classes are held outside the classroom in different environments: museums, towns, artisan laboratories, firms.

### Assessment methods

Courses include two different steps of assessment:

- a placement test
- a final exam

The level of each student is determined solely on the basis of the results of the placement test that students sit upon their arrival. During the course teachers use a system of continuous assessment, to test both oral and written skills. Once a week, during conversation classes, students are invited to perform oral and written tasks in order to test their improvement on language knowledge and giving teachers the opportunity to adjust the learning content of their language classes. The final test takes place in the last days of the course and only students who have regularly attended the classes can sit it. Its objective is to test the progresses of the students along the course and check if they have reached the level of knowledge of the Italian

language indicated in the syllabus. The final exam consists of subtests of the four language skills: speaking, writing, reading and listening. The skills are weighted as follows:  
Speaking: 30% - Writing: 20% - Listening: 30% - Reading: 20%

### Arrangements for providing participants with ECTS

Successful passing of the final examination awards participants a final mark and 5 ECTS credits.

Both credits and final mark are indicated in a certificate issued at the end of the course and delivered to each student. This certificate also includes the level of the course attended, the subjects taken and their weekly schedule, so that home Institutions, at the end of the mobility period, have all necessary information to evaluate the academic recognition of the course. Along with the Final Certificate, a Supplement Certificate containing the program details of the course followed is also issued.

## RESULTS – EXPECTED OUTCOMES

Linguistic and communicative outcomes

At beginner level students will acquire the appropriate grammatical structures and the necessary vocabulary to express the main language functions on various aspects of the social, academic and business life.

Students will be able to describe in simple terms aspects of their background, the environment in which they will operate and the immediate needs of everyday life. At intermediate and advanced level students will be able to understand the general meaning of increasingly complex texts, including the terminology related to their field of work/study; at the same time they will be able to interact spontaneously with native speakers on familiar topics and produce texts on various topics.

By the means of continuous interaction with teachers and tutors, participants will learn how to deal properly in the most common situations, avoiding possible communication and cultural conflicts that could compromise their cultural experience of living in Italy.

All activities included in the courses (off-site classes, theatres, museums, cinemas and exhibitions) give students the opportunity to learn as much as possible about the Italian culture in all its expressions.
