Program Structure	Exchange students are required to enroll in a minimum of 8 courses per semester.
	Each course is made up of one 90min class per week. (Some courses have two
	classes per week). The 8 course minimum may include a combination of Japanese
	language and academic courses in taught in English or Japanese depending on the student's language proficiency level. Students are expected to come with the intention
	of working toward attaining pass grades for all the courses that they enroll in.
Japanese Language Course	Classes begin from beginner level, but a demonstration of interest to enroll is required
	at the time of application. Students not wanting to enroll in Japanese language
Approximate costs (in Van)	classes may fill their schedule with English taught academic courses.
Approximate costs (in Yen)	Students are advised to prepare 100,000yen minimum per month for living expenses
	when staying in KSU student accommodation. More may be needed if staying off-
	campus.
Accommodation (Dormitory)	- Admission Fee: Single - 30,000yen, Twin room – 20,000yen (Non-refundable)
(<u>Limited availability</u>)	- Room fee: Single 38,000yen (monthly), Twin 19,000yen (monthly) - Bond: A two month bond is payable with first month of room fees.
	Bonds are applied to the final two months room fees of the resident's stay.
	- Bedding: 6,600yen per semester. Total for period of stay payable at time of
	admission.
	(Rental fees for off-campus accommodation range from around 50,000yen per month.
	Amenities, bonds, other fees may not be included.)
	* Priority will be given to students staying 1 semester. Students intending to stay 2
	semesters may be offered dormitory accommodation for the first semester of their
	exchange, subject to availability, but may be asked to find off-campus
	accommodation from their second semester. Students staying for 2 semesters should be prepared to stay off-campus if necessary.
	*Fees are subject to change.
Study materials	Approx. 5,000yen per semester for Japanese language text books.
Food	30-40,000yen (monthly) - depending on individual diet.

Insurance	All exchange and YAP students MUST prepare comprehensive travel insurance (not only health insurance) from their home country. All students are also required by
	Japanese law to enter the Japanese National Health Insurance scheme for the period
	of their stay. This will cost around 2,500yen per month. Information on how to apply
	will be given during orientation.
City transportation	Approx. 5,000yen/month. More for students living off-campus.
Banks	Students will be advised during orientation on where and how to open bank accounts.
	It is advisable to have access to funds for living costs from the student's home
	country while in Japan without the need to open a bank account in Japan.
Phones	Pick up a SIM card at an international airport upon arrival. Alternatively, book on in
	advance through a company such as sakura mobile.
Leisure	Approx. 20,000yen/month - depending on individual.
Buddy program	Students will be paired with a Japanese student buddy who will help with study and
	questions on daily living. Participation in this program is optional.

Nearest airport:

Kansai International Airport – Approx. 3hours by public transport, 2.5hours by shuttle from KSU.

Students can book shuttle buses from Kansai International Airport or Itami airport if transferring from Narita/Haneda.

Please arrange your own transport to KSU. It is not possible for KSU staff to meet students individually at the airport.

Advice will be given regarding arrival requirements including transport options, etc.
